We know that lasting personal and social change comes about when we all work together. That's why, at our Y, strengthening community is our cause. Every day, we work side-by-side with our neighbors to make sure that everyone, regardless of age, income or background, has the opportunity to learn, grow and thrive.

OUR IMPACT IS FELT EVERY DAY A Focus on Academic Achievement

About 200 children who attend YMCA after-school programs in Lombard, Villa Park, and Oakbrook Terrace are picking up an extra dose of math lessons. And are enjoying it.

29 countries outperformed the U.S. in mathematics, and 22 countries outperformed the U.S. in science (2012 Program for International Student Assessment) and one million related jobs will go unfilled in this country by 2018 even though workers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) typically earn 26% more than people with comparable experience in other fields (U.S. Dept. of Commerce).

The Tri-Town YMCA isn't claiming there is an easy solution. But it does offer extra time, lessons designed to feel like fun, career awareness building, and a chance for more parental engagement. Each Y after school site offers four days a week on average of lessons that incorporate math in engaging ways such as Jump Rope Math and Art Math. Next on the horizon is Music Math. The Y is also partnering with the school districts to begin making "FasttMath" available to youth after school.
